White. Liquid. No serious effects anticipated under normal conditions of use. Leave area to breathe fresh air. Avoid further overexposure. If symptoms persist, get medical attention.

Chronic Health Effects

Fillers are encapsulated and not expected to be released from product under normal conditions of use. Prolonged or repeated exposure to mineral spirits (petroleum naphtha or stoddard solvent) may cause defatting, drying, and irritation of the skin, dermatitis, central nervous system (CNS) effects, and adverse liver, kidney, and lung effects.

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SECTION 4 - FIRST AID MEASURES

Get immediate medical attention for any significant overexposure.

SECTION 6 - ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

SECTION 7 - HANDLING AND STORAGE

Store in sealed containers in a dry, ventilated warehouse location above freezing.

- Skin and body protection : Prevent contact with shoes and clothing. Use rubber apron and overshoes.
- Protective measures : Other equipment not normally required. Use professional judgment in the selection, care, and use.
